We are very much looking forward to the conference, which will feature a keynote speech by Prof. Elaine Scarry (Walter M. Cabot Professor of Aesthetics and the General Theory of Value, Harvard University).

In preparation for the Colloquy and for our next AWS business meeting, I would like all members of the AWS society to take note of some important information:

- 1. In order to attend or to present at the colloquy, you must be an up-to-date member of the AWS. - 2. There are <u>no</u> registration fees attached to attending the AWS colloquy, but please note that all individuals wishing to attend must register before February 29th 2020. (The link is provided below)

The Treasurer will be <u>elected</u> for a three-year term. The duties are related to finances and membership. The Treasurer monitors the financial health of the organization. The Treasurer receives dues, is responsible for disbursements and for reporting to the Board the state of the finances of the Society. The treasurer can be elected for a second term. The current Treasurer, Ben Davis, will provide detailed instructions to the next Treasurer (to be elected at Boston College).
